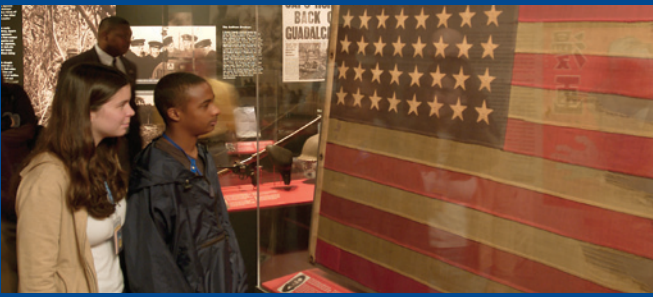

VISITOR INFORMATION

- ★ The Museum is open 7 days a week, 9am - 5pm. Closed on Mardi Gras Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.
- ★ All World War II Veterans are encouraged to stop by the Information Desk in the Louisiana Memorial Pavilion to sign our Roll of Honor.
- ★ In the Malcolm Forbes Theater, documentary films are shown daily on the half-hour from 9:30am - 3:30pm.
- ★ The Museum is fully accessible to visitors in wheelchairs. A limited number of wheelchairs are available at no charge for use in the Museum.
- ★ Museum Welcome Guides are available in French, Spanish, German and Braille.
- ★ For information on Membership, Artifact Donations, School Field Trips and Group Tours, please inquire at the Information Desk.
- ★ No flash or video photography and no tripods allowed in the Museum galleries or in the Stage Door Canteen.
- ★ No food, drink, smoking or pets allowed in the Museum except for service animals.

A MUSEUM AS EPIC AS THE WAR IT HONORS

The National World War II Museum is still growing! Opening in June, 2011, the **John E. Kushner Restoration Pavilion** will offer the public a behind-the-scenes view of the restoration of the WWII-vintage, Higgins Industries-built motor torpedo boat PT-305 and other iconic tools of the war effort.

The United States Freedom Pavilion and **The Boeing Center**, opening in fall, 2012, will be the Museum's largest building, a soaring architectural statement anchoring the entire Museum campus. Honoring all branches of military service, the Pavilion will showcase major artifacts essential to the Allied victory, including a restored Boeing B-17 "Flying Fortress," four additional aircraft, and an extraordinary virtual submarine experience recreating the final voyage of the USS *Tang*.

Next will follow the **Campaigns Pavilion**, transporting visitors to the front lines of history: the jungle warfare of Guadalcanal, the Tunisia campaign near North Africa's Kasserine Pass and the frozen forests of the Battle of the Bulge. And, finally, the **Liberation Pavilion**, illuminating the Holocaust, the end of the war, and the joys, costs and meaning of liberation and freedom.

The completed campus, with pavilions surrounding the **Battle Barksdale Parade Ground**, will be the region's premier cultural destination attraction.
