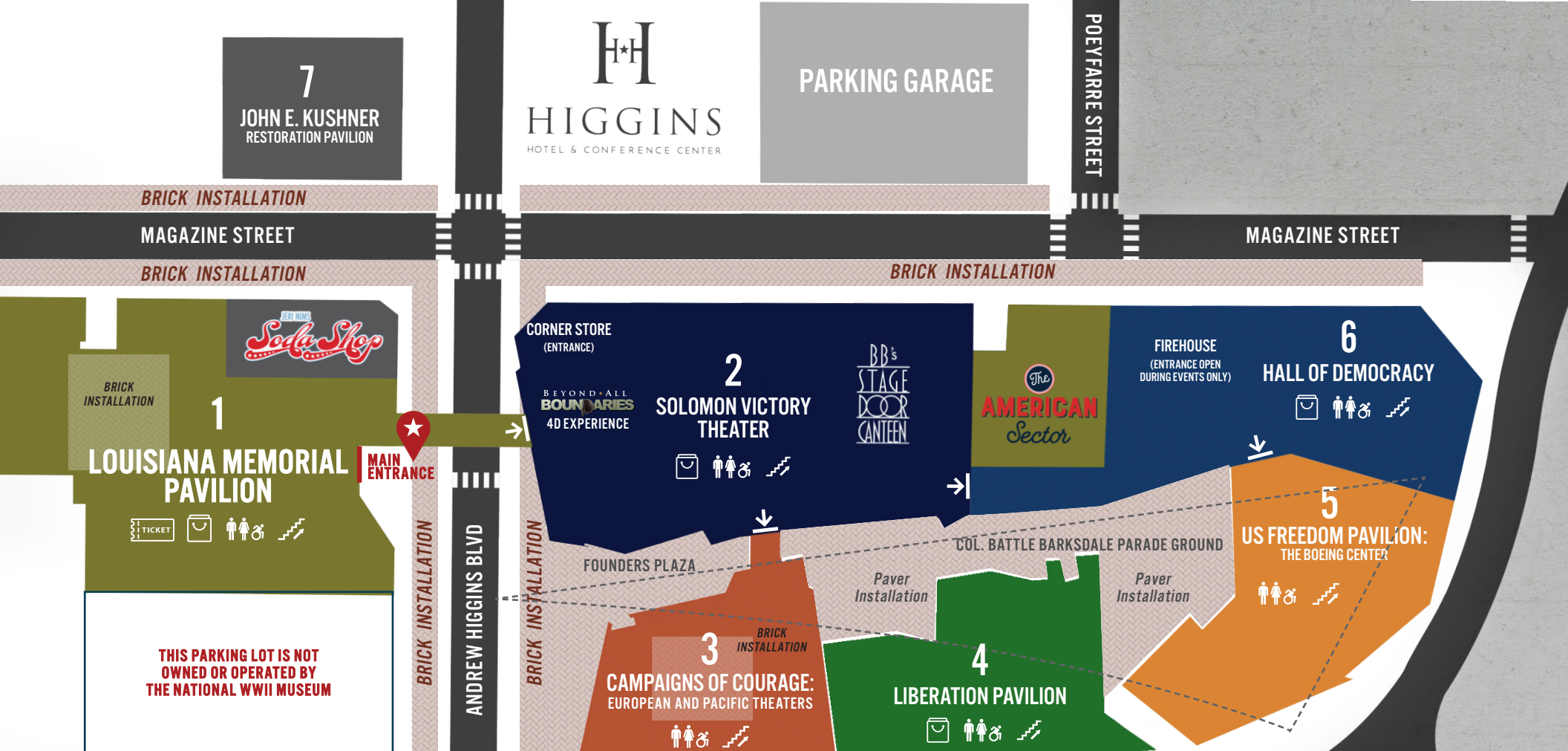
Since the campaign's launch, over nine million Museum visitors have seen the more than 55,000 classic red Victory bricks that line our campus—each an enduring, physical memory. Located on the sidewalks of the Museum's campus, these classic red bricks are among the most meaningful features.

As we complete our physical campus, we also offer Victory pavers in four different size options that will be installed in the heart of our campus on the Col. Battle Barksdale Parade Ground and Founders Plaza.

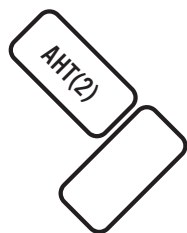
THE MUSEUM CAMPUS

STEP 1

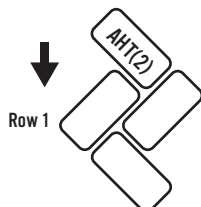
Find the section indicator brick



STEP 2

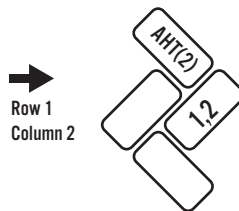
Example: AHT(2) 1,2

Second coordinate number is the column number or your brick's location in the row, counting from left to right

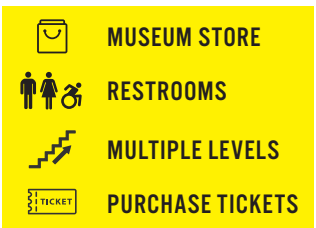

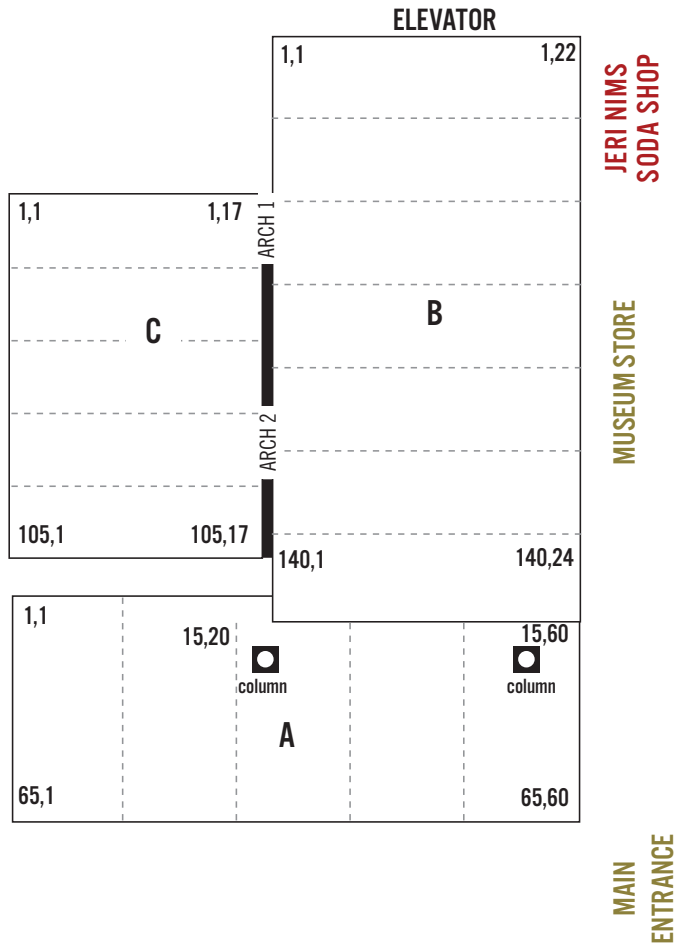
