


S WE MARKED the Museum's silver anniversary on June 6, 2025, I had the privilege of individually recognizing 23 members of the WWII generation at the Dr. Hal Baumgarten D-Day Commemoration. Being able to watch these veterans, Home Front workers, Holocaust survivors, and resistance fighters process in and out of the event, one by one, and highlight their wartime contributions to the room full of grateful Americans reminded me of just how special the Museum is, and has always been, to the men and women for whom it was built. This year's D-Day ceremony was among a dozen events we hosted over a two-week period that allowed us to thank WWII veterans, reflect on our achievements, recognize those who built the Museum into what it is today, and share the significance of our mission with a local and national audience.

There were many magical moments throughout the 25th anniversary festivities, from toasting my fellow Trustees Paul Hilliard, Boysie Bollinger, and Nick Mueller at this year's American Spirit Awards Gala; to watching a riveting multimedia performance of *The Eyes of the World: From D-Day to VE Day* at the Orpheum Theater; to welcoming more than 4,000 visitors to campus for our 25th Anniversary Family and Member Day. It was truly a pleasure to celebrate all the support that has propelled the Museum to where it is today.

Since opening our doors as a single pavilion focused on the D-Day invasion of Normandy in 2000, it is incredible to reflect on how the Museum has transformed into an impressive seven-acre, seven-pavilion campus that tells the complete story of the war with over 300,000 artifacts and 12,000 personal accounts. And our impact has significantly deepened over time—from the 10 million visitors we've welcomed to our campus, to the more than 820,000 nationwide Charter Members we've enrolled, to the nearly three million students and teachers we've reached both in person and digitally with our historical content, and so much more. Seeing how far we've come over the years has been inspiring.

It has been an honor to serve as Board Chair during this special time for the Museum, and I am grateful for the efforts and generosity of so many others who helped us reach this point. That includes my fellow Trustees, past and present, whose leadership has been integral to our success over the years. My thanks as well to all those who have already generously contributed to the goals laid out in our Victory's Promise fundraising campaign, and to Museum President & CEO Stephen Watson for his leadership in overseeing this important phase of growth for the institution. Of course, none of this would be possible without the many Members, program supporters, community partners, staff, and volunteers who continue to champion the Museum year after year.

This vast support is a testament to the public's enduring belief in our mission. But it also reminds us that there is still much work to be done to achieve our vision to become the most accessible resource for trusted knowledge on the American experience in World War II. In the coming pages, you'll see some of the ways we're working toward that aspiration.

As I prepare to pass the gavel to the new Board Chair in June, I look forward to making continued progress toward these initiatives. I'm proud of what we've achieved in these important months and am excited about our next chapter.

Letter from the President &

N THE MUSEUM'S 25TH ANNIVERSARY, it was an honor to publicly announce Victory's Promise—our new 10-year, \$300 million comprehensive fundraising campaign to dramatically expand the Museum's educational impact over the next decade. I am certain this campaign will be just as impactful in reaching new audiences as our Road to Victory Capital Campaign was in completing the buildout of our campus, and I am grateful to all those who helped us achieve that 20-year vision. Still, we know there is more work to do to reach beyond our walls and fulfill our educational mission—and Victory's Promise will make that possible.

Here at the Museum, we believe World War II was one of the most consequential events in human history. Nothing more clearly demonstrates what humanity is capable of—good and bad—than this monumental moment in time. That is why it must always be taught and studied, both within and beyond the classroom, and preserved in institutions like ours. It is a sacred responsibility, especially as there are fewer members of the WWII generation to share their firsthand experiences with us. To ensure this important story stays alive, we, as America's National WWII Museum, must tell it.

This means making a bold commitment to go beyond our New Orleans campus and viewing our educational initiatives as equally important to the exhibits housed within our walls. It means building upon all that we have achieved by improving our visitor experience, increasing the accessibility of our collections, and deepening our commitment to students, teachers, and lifelong learners.

The Museum's collection of artifacts, oral histories, and exhibits brings history to life in a way that no textbook can. Over the next decade, we will make significant investments in our campus—overhauling older exhibits, enhancing existing experiences, and adding new buildings and spaces—to ensure we're continuing to inspire visitors of all ages with this Still, we know that the vast majority of Americans will never walk through our doors, and we are significantly expanding our traveling exhibits program to bring our WWII artifacts and stories to communities large and small across the country. We must also become the go-to online resource for everything World War II-related, strengthening our digital content and collections to serve as a trusted resource for students, teachers, and the many other members of the public interested in the war. And to better support these groups, we will reimagine our field trip experience, expand our teacher training programs, and educate new generations on the key leadership principles and skills exemplified by the WWII generation.

As you can see, there is much on the horizon for the next 10 years and beyond, and I am humbled to serve as President & CEO during such a meaningful time for our institution. Still, we know this is just the beginning, and I thank our Board Chair Suzanne Mestayer for her tireless leadership as we embark on this next chapter. By upholding our promise to the WWII generation, to those who have built this Museum, and to future generations, we will keep the dialogue and public memory of World War II alive.

2025 Annual Report

The War in 1945

HE FINAL YEAR OF THE WAR began with American forces in the Pacific fighting to liberate the Philippines, eventually reaching Manila, where intense urban fighting lasted for weeks. More brutal fighting followed as US troops fought to seize the islands of Iwo Jima and Okinawa. In Europe, leaders from the United States, United Kingdom, and the Soviet Union met in the Crimean city of Yalta to discuss

planning for the postwar world. As Allied troops approached Berlin, they saw the horrors of the Nazi regime firsthand as they liberated survivors from numerous concentration camps. On May 8, less than a month after the death of President Franklin D. Roosevelt, the war in Europe officially ended. Another conference was held in Potsdam, Germany, to further discuss the fate of newly defeated Germany and outline terms

of surrender for Japan. Japan rejected those terms, and, soon after, the United States dropped two atomic bombs on the island nation—the first on Hiroshima on August 6 and the second on Nagasaki three days later. Japan accepted the terms of the Potsdam Declaration on August 15, with the formal surrender taking place on September 2. With that, the war that changed the world was over.

Battle of Manila

As part of the campaign to liberate the Philippines from Japanese control, American and Filipino troops fought to retake the capital city of Manila. The monthlong battle saw fierce urban fighting, which devastated the city and brought high civilian casualties. Allied troops also liberated American civilians and prisoners of war from the Santo Tomas Internment Camp, including the US Army and Navy nurses known as the "Angels of Bataan." The battle marked a key victory near the end of the three-year campaign.

Battle of Okinawa

APRIL 1 - JUNE 22

Okinawa's rugged terrain and heavy rain made movement difficult for American soldiers and Marines, while Japanese kamikaze attacks sank or damaged hundreds of Allied ships offshore. Casualties were high among American and Japanese forces as well as the local Okinawan population. The battle, like the battle for Iwo Jima, was marked with increasing violence, foreshadowing heavy losses for the planned invasion of Japan.

V-E Day

As the collapse of the Nazi regime loomed, Adolf Hitler took his own life on April 30, and his successors quickly surrendered unconditionally to Allied forces. President Harry S. Truman designated May 8 as V-E (Victory in Europe) Day as celebrations erupted around the world. Americans gathered to sing and celebrate and flocked to houses of worship to give thanks. Despite their relief that the war in Europe had ended, many servicemembers wondered if they would be sent to the Pacific next.

Dropping of the Atomic Bombs

Facing the prospect of a costly invasion of the Japanese home islands, the United States dropped atomic bombs on two Japanese cities, Hiroshima and Nagasaki. These new weapons devastated both cities, and soon after, Japanese Emperor Hirohito ordered the Japanese military to accept the Allies' terms of surrender.















Yalta Conference FEBRUARY 4-11

As the Allies pushed closer to Berlin, the leaders of the United States, United Kingdom, and Soviet Union met in the city of Yalta to discuss postwar plans. Key discussion points included the division of Germany and Berlin into four occupation zones, the future of Poland and other liberated Eastern European nations, and plans to prosecute war criminals before an international court. The Soviet Union also promised to enter the war in the Pacific within three months of Germany's surrender.

Liberation of Ohrdruf

As Allied soldiers pushed toward Berlin, they liberated hundreds of Nazi concentration camps and subcamps. The first camp liberated by American soldiers was Ohrdruf, where they encountered charred remains, evidence of torture, and emaciated survivors. General Dwight D. Eisenhower requested that congressmembers and newspaper editors be flown to Europe to tour the camps to counter any future denial of these horrors. He also directed more American soldiers to visit the camps and see what they had been fighting for.

Potsdam Conference JULY 17 - AUGUST 2

As the war still raged in the Pacific, the leaders of the United States, United Kingdom, and Soviet Union met once again, this time in Potsdam, Germany. Despite a tense and distrustful atmosphere among the Allies, they formalized the occupation and denazification of Germany and issued the Potsdam Declaration, which called for Japan's unconditional surrender.

Surrender of Japan & V-J Day AUGUST 15 & SEPTEMBER 2

After the dropping of the atomic bombs and the Soviet Union's invasion of Manchuria, Emperor Hirohito recorded a message accepting the terms of the Potsdam Declaration, which was broadcast on August 15. The formal surrender took place on September 2 on the deck of the USS *Missouri*. President Truman designated September 2 as America's official V-J (Victory over Japan) Day, and celebrations once again erupted across the United States. World War II was finally over.



The National WWW Museum Celebrates 25 Years

INSTITUTION MARKS MILESTONE ANNIVERSARY WITH WEEKLONG CELEBRATION

HE NATIONAL WWII MUSEUM'S beginnings can be traced back over three decades, when friends and University of New Orleans professors Stephen Ambrose, PhD, and Gordon H. "Nick" Mueller, PhD, discussed plans for a museum that would tell the story of the D-Day invasion of Normandy and World War II, and preserve the accounts of the everyday Americans who fought against fascist tyranny. On June 6, 2000, the 56th anniversary of the Normandy landings, that vision was realized when The National D-Day Museum opened as a single exhibition hall in the heart of New Orleans, the city where Higgins Industries' famous landing craft were produced.

It wasn't long until the Museum began expanding to cover the full story of the American wartime experience—from the Home Front to the battlefields and beyond. Designated by Congress as America's national museum for World War II in 2004, the institution officially adopted a new name and new mission to reflect this momentous mandate. The National WWII Museum has since grown in size, scope, and impact from a single building into a seven-acre, seven-pavilion campus with immersive exhibits, award-winning multimedia experiences, dynamic educational resources, and an expansive collection of powerful artifacts and first-person accounts.

Now rated the top attraction in New Orleans and among the best museums in the world, the Museum remains dedicated to honoring those

who came together to defeat the Axis powers: the servicemembers storming beaches and battlefields across Europe and the Pacific; the factory workers on the Home Front; the Holocaust survivors who experienced the horrors of Nazi tyranny and the joys of liberation. Their stories have always been at the heart of the Museum.

From May 29 through June 7, 2025, the Museum marked its 25th anniversary with special events to honor the WWII generation and the values they embody, reflect on the Museum's achievements, and unveil its plans for the next decade.

The National WWII Museum has accomplished a great deal over the past 25 years, steadfast in its pledge to honor those who gave so much to achieve Allied victory and ensure the history of the war lives on. As it looks to the future, the Museum is committed to engaging new audiences on its campus and around the world, ensuring that the WWII generation's service, sacrifice, and victory continue to inspire for generations to come.

Institution

ERVING AS THE OFFICIAL KICKOFF to The National WWII Museum's 25th Anniversary Celebration, the 2025 American Spirit Awards honored the Museum's origins, its years of growth, and the foundational leaders behind its success. The award recognizes individuals who, through their life's work, exemplify the outstanding qualities of the American spirit and inspire these values in others.

The 2025 award recipients included three individuals who have had a transformative impact on the growth and development of the Museum and have made tremendous contributions to their communities and country: New Orleans businessman Donald T. "Boysie" Bollinger, WWII veteran C. Paul Hilliard, and Museum Founding President & CEO Emeritus Gordon H. "Nick" Mueller, PhD.

Bollinger has been among the Museum's strongest champions since its earliest days. As the longtime Chairman and CEO of Bollinger Shipyards, a family business launched after World War II, Bollinger

presided over shipbuilding and repair facilities from New Orleans to Houston. He joined The National D-Day Museum's Board of Directors in 1995 and became Chair shortly after the Grand Opening in 2000. Since then, Bollinger has committed substantial time and resources to making the Museum one of the best in the world, rallying vital support from government officials, prospective donors, community leaders, and friends.

The only WWII veteran currently serving on the Museum's Board, Hilliard has lived a life of service while making a name for himself as an entrepreneur, corporate executive, and philanthropist. At 17 years old, Hilliard joined the US Marine Corps, flying 45 combat missions in the Pacific as a radioman and gunner in Douglas SBD Dauntless dive bombers. Following the war and college, he founded Badger Oil in Lafayette, Louisiana. Over nearly two decades, he has become one of the Museum's most ardent advocates, supporting its educational mission and the preservation of oral histories and aircraft. He served as Board Chair from 2018 to 2020, bringing a unique perspective to the role

No one has had as much of an influence on the Museum over the past three decades as Mueller, Founding President & CEO Emeritus. A historian and former Vice Chancellor at the University of New Orleans, Mueller played a key role in developing new programs and founding the UNO Research and Technology Park. He served as Board Chair of The National D-Day Museum from 1998 to 2000, guiding the institution through its Grand Opening. He then led the Museum as President & CEO for 17 years, working to expand its mission, campus, and educational initiatives—establishing the Museum as one of our nation's top cultural institutions.

As part of the American Spirit Awards events, which included the American Spirit Awards Gala presented by Hancock Whitney, the Museum also bestowed the Billy Michal Student Leadership Award to 51 students from each state and the District of Columbia who embody the American spirit in their communities. These students had the opportunity to hear from the 2025 American Spirit Award recipients during a special leadership forum presented by Kevin G. Clifford Family.

"There was no national cry for a National WWII Museum or even a D-Day Museum when Stephen Ambrose had the idea to do it. WWII veterans must have been thinking in the '70s and '80s, 'Who will write our history? Who will tell our story?' What they witnessed, why they fought, what they achieved. With Boysie and Paul and others, we have done that in this museum."


Museum Expands Educational Footprint on Magazine Street


WITH NEWLY ACQUIRED AND RENOVATED PROPERTIES, MUSEUM DEEPENS ITS COMMITMENT TO EDUCATION

S IT PREPARES to dramatically expand its educational programs to support students, teachers, scholars, and lifelong learners both in Louisiana and throughout the country,

The National WWII Museum has also continued to expand its campus in downtown New Orleans. Its growing presence along three blocks of Magazine Street will help the Museum further its goals to engage more visitors, embrace innovation and technology, and inspire learners of all ages.

On the south end, the Museum has broken ground on the Floyd Education and Collections Pavilion and opened the new Museum Archives and Research Center. On the next block stands The Higgins Hotel & Conference Center, which hosts the annual International Conference on World War II. On the north end, John E. Kushner Restoration Pavilion now offers visitors views of PT-305 and other WWII macro-artifacts, while a newly acquired warehouse property contiguous to the Pavilion will enable the continued growth of the Museum's mission.





Museum Archives and Research Center

The Museum's vast collection of artifacts, archival materials, and oral histories about the American experience in World War II is unparalleled and serves as an essential resource for researchers, educators, and the public. Standing as a testament to the Museum's commitment to accessibility, the Museum Archives and Research Center enhances the capacity to preserve, expand, and share these collections. Housed in the renovated historic warehouse on the corner of Magazine and Poeyfarre Streets, the state-of-the-art facility features upgraded storage and preservation spaces, which also anticipates future growth of the collection; an archival digitization lab; a reading room for on-site researchers and visiting scholars; and the Museum Institutional Records and Archives.

Newly Acquired Warehouse Property

The newest addition to the campus was generously donated to the Museum by the Arlene and Joseph Meraux Charitable Foundation. Located at 906, 916, and 922 Magazine Street, the property will provide much-needed space that the Museum anticipates using for staff offices meeting rooms, artifact and equipment storage, and future needs related to the institution's expanding educational outreach efforts.



Floyd Education and Collections Pavilion & Sanderson Leadership Center

In April 2025, the Museum broke ground on the Floyd Education and Collections Pavilion, a new complex that will support the Museum's growing efforts to produce more exhibits, continue preserving its macroartifacts, and expand its leadership programs.

To provide greater access to the Museum's collection of more than 300,000 artifacts and archival materials, the Pavilion will include a dedicated exhibit design and production center, centralizing and expanding the Museum's development of new special exhibits for future display at its New Orleans campus and other institutions across the country. Additionally, the ground floor of the new facility will house numerous historic vehicles and oversized collection artifacts, bringing back to campus these historic treasures that previously were stored off-site.

The second floor of the Pavilion will house the new Sanderson Leadership Center, where the Museum will offer a full slate of signature leadership programs based on the events and lessons of World War II for corporate and nonprofit executives, civic and military leaders, and students and educators. With an emphasis on strategic thinking and key leadership principles like ethics and decisiveness, these new tailored seminars, lectures, and interactive scenarios will help promote team building, communication, and problem-solving, while youth-specific programs will encourage civic awareness for new generations of American leaders. Construction plans include a custom-built environment that will fully immerse participants in role-playing leadership programs based on WWII events, enhancing their experience and bringing the history of the war to life in new ways.

The new Pavilion is made possible through a \$7.5 million gift from longtime Museum supporters Timber and Peggy Floyd, with additional support from the State of Louisiana

Peggy Floyd never knew much about her father's service in World War II. He rarely spoke of it when she was growing up; all she knew was that he had been a bombardier. But everything changed in 2015 when she walked into US Freedom Pavilion: The Boeing Center for the first time.

"I looked at that plane," she recalled, "and realized—that was where my father sat." Although natives of Texas, Peggy and her late husband, Timber, fell in love with New Orleans. On their frequent visits, they found themselves returning to the Museum again and again, captivated by its exhibits. Through the years, the Floyds' support grew to include key initiatives like *Fighting for the Right to Fight: African American Experiences in World War II* special exhibit, Victory Ball, and the Family and Military Appreciation Block Party, to name a few. "We want to make the Museum accessible to everybody," she said. Recently, Peggy returned to celebrate as the Museum broke ground on the Floyd Education and Collections Pavilion, a new space that reflects her and Timber's deep commitment to the Museum's educational mission.

Thanks to research conducted by Museum historians, Peggy has also been able to learn more about her father's service. As an airman with the Seventh Air Force, First Lieutenant Nicholas Dragisic flew in the B-24 Liberators with the 11th Bombardment Group in the 431st Bombardment Squadron. From 1943 to 1944, Nicholas participated in the island-hopping campaign across the Central Pacific, braving Japanese interceptors and vast ocean stretches. After all these years, Peggy finally connected with his story.

Today, Peggy sees the Museum as an anchor—not just for New Orleans, but for the state of Louisiana. "If just one child leaves here understanding the importance of this war," she said, "then we've done our job."

Educational Outreach at The Higgins Hotel

As the official hotel of The National WWII Museum, The Higgins Hotel & Conference Center serves as an important vehicle for advancing the Museum's educational mission in addition to offering first-class accommodations, meeting spaces, and dining options. In addition to supporting the Museum's expanding scholarly programs, The Higgins Hotel provides lodging and meeting spaces for students, teachers, enthusiasts, corporate clients, reunion groups, military groups, and more who participate in these programs or plan their own.

Each summer, the Hotel hosts students participating in two of the Museum's signature educational programs for high school and college students—Normandy Academy and Student Leadership Academy—and educators attending workshops that deepen their understanding of the war and provide practical teaching strategies and classroom tools. In the fall, the Hotel welcomes guests from all over the world to the International Conference on World War II presented by the Jenny Craig Institute for the Study of War and Democracy, which brings together top scholars, authors, historians, and witnesses to history for three days of expert discussions. Throughout the year, the Museum enriches the experience for Hotel guests with events that add to its historical offerings, including Wartime Piano Happy Hour in the Tom and Polly Gruber Patriots Circle Lounge and Historian Happy Hour in Kilroy's Bar & Lounge.

Since opening in 2019, the Hotel has been honored to host every WWII veteran participating in the Gary Sinise Foundation Soaring Valor Program, which honors WWII veterans through immersive visits to the Museum. The Higgins Hotel is also the perfect host for guests attending special events like the Museum's 25th anniversary celebrations—during which it welcomed more than 20 members of the WWII generation, two tour groups, Arizona State University graduates, the Museum's Board of Trustees, Patriots Circle Members, the cast and producers of *The Eyes of the World: From D-Day to VE Day*, among other guests.





Rosie the Riveters Honored for Wartime Service

HE NATIONAL WWII MUSEUM celebrated National Rosie the Riveter Day on March 21, 2025, by welcoming 18 women wartime workers—real-life "Rosies"—to their museum from around the country on a specially dedicated trip through the Gary Sinise Foundation's Soaring Valor program.

During World War II, millions of American women on the Home Front answered the call to join the wartime workforce, many for the first time, as job opportunities in the defense industry that had traditionally belonged only to men opened to women. By taking on new roles, these women, known as "Rosie the Riveters," helped produce critical supplies, support the Allied fighting forces, and reshape American society.

Upon arrival, these guests of honor were met with applause and signs of gratitude from local students and Museum guests and staff. Many wore polka dots in a nod to J. Howard Miller's iconic "We Can Do It!" poster, whose heroine has become synonymous with Rosie the Riveter and a representation of all women who worked in production and defense during the war.

The Rosies, accompanied by students from the Academy of the Sacred Heart in New Orleans, paraded into the Museum and spent the day touring exhibits. An obligatory stop was the Manufacturing Victory gallery in *The Arsenal of Democracy: The Herman and George R. Brown Salute to the Home Front* exhibit, where the significance of the trailblazing contributions of women in the wartime workforce is highlighted. The Rosies, who were in their 90s and 100s, shared stories of a time decades ago when they stepped into shipyards and onto factory floors to learn new trades and aid their country in a time of war.

The memorable day was capped off with a special commemoration to present each Rosie with the Congressional Gold Medal in recognition of her dedicated service during World War II. The Rosie the Riveter Congressional Gold Medal Act was signed into law in December 2020, and the Museum was honored to help pay tribute to these women workers whose contributions paved the way for future generations.

ROBERTA "RANDY" TIDMORE

Born in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, in March 1922, Roberta "Randy" Tidmore worked at the J. J. Case Company in Rockford, Illinois, for six months in 1943 doing sheet metal work, finishing wings for B-26 aircraft. Bored with her position and looking for opportunity, Tidmore enlisted in the US Marine Corps Women's Reserve. Sergeant Tidmore is featured in the Museum's special exhibit *Our War Too: Women in Service*, now traveling the country with recent appearances at the Henry Ford Museum and the Atlanta History Center. In the exhibit's culminating film, Tidmore reports how, at 21 years old, she didn't want to be an officer—she wanted to be a mechanic. After the war, she continued to

Living History: Aleutian Islands Veterans Attend Opening of On American Shores

SPECIAL EXHIBIT SHEDS LIGHT ON A "FORGOTTEN" EPISODE OF WORLD WAR II AND THE AFTERMATH THAT RESONATES TO THIS DAY





HE MUSEUM'S SPECIAL EXHIBIT On American Shores: The Aleutians Islands Campaign examines the oftenoverlooked 1942 Japanese invasion of the Aleutian Islands in Alaska and the subsequent efforts to reclaim the only North American soil seized during World War II. At the March 26, 2025, exhibit opening, Aleutian campaign veterans Ira Milan and Jesse Magee, representing both the Army and Navy, served as living reminders of this oft-forgotten theater of war and testaments to the importance of preserving all aspects of World War II.

A native of New Orleans, 102-year-old Boatswain's Mate Second Class Ira Benedict Milan joined the Naval Construction Battalions, or "Seabees," on December 14, 1942. Arriving in the Aleutians in August 1943, Milan served on the island of Attu before returning to the States and shipping out to the Philippines with the 5th Special Naval Construction Battalion. While attending the opening, Milan was able to meet Jim Letten, the son of his wartime friend Alden Letten. The two shared stories and wartime photos of Letten and Milan, highlighting the personal connections forged by the war across generations.

Mississippi-born Private First Class Jesse J. Magee, 103 at the time of the exhibit's opening, served 18 months in the Aleutians on Adak and Shemya as a member of Company A, 364th Infantry Regiment. Originally trained

as a combat infantryman, Magee's segregated unit was instead sent north to serve as stevedores and maintainers. Magee had many stories to relate to the Museum's oral historians from his time in the Aleutians, even joking about life on Shemya, and it was through his participation in the oral history program that Magee was able to see himself quoted in the new exhibition. Highlighting and honoring his service through the Museum's exhibit and oral history collection helps further the public's understanding of both the war and the wide range of Americans who answered the call over 80 years ago.

Numerous families of veterans who served in the Aleutians have been able to experience the exhibition in person or have contacted the Museum regarding stories and artifacts. Just as Milan and Magee's presence helped highlight surviving veterans of the Aleutians, these descendants of veterans have been able to learn more about the often-overlooked service of their family members honored at the Museum.

The Museum's WWWI Podcasts and the Power of Digital Storytelling

HOW PODCASTING BRINGS WWII HISTORY
TO LIFE FOR GLOBAL AUDIENCES

The Museum's podcast series 1945 debuted in April 2025 in conjunction with the 80th anniversary of the end of World War II STHE LARGEST, DEADLIEST CONFLICT IN HUMAN HISTORY, World War II was the most important story of the 20th century—a story The National WWII Museum is charged with upholding. And though the last shots of the war rang out some 80 years ago, its ripple effects are still felt today. New information is frequently unearthed, deepening our understanding of this monumental time in American and world history.

The Museum acts as a permanent home for this knowledge, but a campus has physical limits. We know this institution must do more to engage those who have never entered—and may never enter—its doors. Today, the Museum is reaching wider audiences through one of the most popular methods of digital storytelling: podcasts.

Since 2018, the Museum has launched six podcast series: Service on Celluloid; "To the Best of My Ability"; World War II On Topic; Making Masters of the Air; Antisemitism: The Fight in WWII America; and 1945. Through seamless collaboration between the Museum's WWII Media Center, the Jenny Craig Institute for the Study of War and Democracy, and other Museum teams, each show brings to life different aspects of the war, from the challenges faced by America's wartime presidents to the firsthand accounts of everyday servicemembers to the real stories behind popular depictions of World War II in television and film.

A new six-part series, 1945, premiered in April 2025 to commemorate the 80th anniversary of the end of World War II. Hosted by New York Times best-selling author Donald Miller and Playtone producer Kirk Saduski, the

podcast, sponsored by The Long Family, takes listeners on a journey through the intense final months of the war. Through new interviews with expert historians like Richard B. Frank and Pulitzer Prize winner Doris Kearns Goodwin, archival material from the Museum's collection, and readings by Academy Award nominees Patricia Clarkson and Gary Sinise, the story of one of the most consequential years in modern history is told in an accessible, engaging way.

Today, the Museum's collection of podcasts has been played more than a million times, reaching audiences far beyond New Orleans. And that number will only grow as the Museum develops more long-form, narrative-focused podcasts like *The Secret WWII: Spies & Special Ops*, a new podcast exploring wartime tales of espionage and intrigue.

Through these podcasts, anyone with an internet connection can journey through the Museum's archives and listen to stories from the past, making history accessible by inviting listeners to "sit in" with historians, veterans, and storytellers as if they were part of the conversation. The importance of that intimate participation is summed up perfectly by Miller in the final episode of 1945:

"Sometimes remembering is very difficult because it can be awfully painful, even when it's joyous. I think it's poignant to place yourself ... on the spot that a certain event in history took place. ... You're consciously remembering that you're part of the story. And if you write it down, all the better, because then you're a true participant. That's the importance of history."

HE NATIONAL WWII MUSEUM'S traveling exhibits program raises awareness and fosters connections to America's WWII story as it brings the Museum's expert WWII content to new host institutions around the country, reaching everincreasing audiences.

In FY25, the Museum's traveling exhibit offerings expanded to include *Our War Too: Women in Service*—the institution's largest traveling exhibition to date, featuring nearly 200 artifacts related to the trailblazing efforts of America's WWII military women. In February 2025, the touring exhibit debuted at the California Museum in Sacramento before traveling in May to the Henry Ford Museum in Dearborn, Michigan, where Museum Senior Curator Kimberly Guise provided visitors with an inside look at the exhibit and a special presentation on The National WWII Museum's mission.

A crucial aspect of the traveling exhibits program is the collection of visitor feedback, which provides not only the opportunity for guests to reflect on the exhibits' content but also important data conveying the impact

of the program and informing future exhibit projects. Among the most common sentiments expressed by visitors of all ages to *Our War Too* is a deep sense of pride and appreciation for America's WWII servicewomen, a theme woven throughout the comment books: "As a woman in the Army, serving in a combat role, it is inspiring to see the legacy that came before me and that I have the potential to build onto." "I loved it! Such care and attention to details helps spread the oft-forgotten importance these women played in the war effort!" "Thanks for sharing...can't wait to teach this to my classroom."


So Ready for Laughter: The Legacy of Bob Hope, which tells the story of American entertainer Bob Hope's unique place in the history of World War II and beyond, is now in its fourth year on tour and, in early 2025, began a four-month run at the Bell County Museum in Belton, Texas. Over the years, many guests who have submitted postcards to the "Thanks for the Memory" mailbox within the exhibit have expressed gratitude for and even memories of Bob Hope's contributions to the war effort: "My dad, Ken Chilstrom, was a WWII fighter pilot and always so pleased to tell of the time

in Sicily, 1943, that he was at a dinner with Bob Hope! Dad is now 101 and still likes to tell about how special that was."

As FY25 came to an end in June, *Ghost Army: the Combat Con Artists of World War II*, which examines the experiences of the first tactical deception unit in the US Army, had just concluded its run at the Missouri Historical Society in St. Louis, where it was on display from October 2024 to May 2025. Back in New Orleans, The National WWII Museum was concluding its own run of the newly refreshed *Fighting for the Right to Fight: African American Experiences in World War II*—an exhibit exploring the challenges faced by and accomplishments of African Americans before, during, and after World War II—and preparing it for national touring. These appearances at host venues allow the Museum to connect with new audiences and deepen relationships with Members nationwide—and this reach will only grow as Museum curators continue to develop new and expanded traveling exhibits. With help from the Victory's Promise campaign, these exhibits will enhance the Museum's presence in every region of the country, with a goal of reaching 2 million visitors each year by 2035.

Victory's Promise: Our Plan for the Next Decade

MUSEUM LAUNCHES NEW \$300 MILLION FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGN

HE NATIONAL WWII MUSEUM marked its 25th anniversary on June 6, 2025, with the launch of a new comprehensive fundraising effort aimed at expanding the institution's educational outreach and renewing its commitment to preserving and sharing the stories of the WWII generation. The 10-year, \$300 million Victory's Promise campaign will help the Museum further advance its national educational mission by reaching new audiences at its New Orleans campus and beyond and becoming the most accessible source for trusted knowledge on the American experience in World War II.

One of the most enduring symbols of World War II, "V for Victory" signified hope, strength, and determination as our country came together like never before to ensure freedom prevailed. The Victory's Promise campaign channels that same spirit of unity and commitment embodied by everyday Americans as the Museum looks to ensure this pivotal time in our nation's history remains a source of inspiration and guidance for future generations. This vision is especially important as direct connections to the war fade, and there are fewer opportunities for young people to learn from those who experienced it firsthand.

The campaign will advance the Museum's strategic plan by supporting new initiatives and expanding existing programs to engage wider audiences on the Museum's campus and across the nation; dramatically expanding digital access to its resources and content; and inspiring more students, teachers, and lifelong learners. The institution's national standing, global reach, extensive collection, and dedicated supporters make it uniquely prepared to pursue these bold objectives, grounding these efforts in the work and accomplishments that came before while pursuing new ways to advance the Museum's mission in the years to come.

To ensure it provides a first-rate experience and attracts new visitors, the Museum will invest more than \$100 million in new construction, major renovations, and proactive maintenance to its campus over the next 10 years. Additionally, new and expanded traveling exhibits developed by Museum curators will reach broader audiences across the nation. The Museum's plans also include increased access to its campus for Louisiana students by offering free guided field trips for all Title I schools in Louisiana. These initiatives will help the Museum reach its goal of welcoming one million visitors to campus annually by 2035.

The Museum will also leverage new technologies to reimagine its digital presence and better deliver its wealth of WWII artifacts, expertise, and original content to more people around the world. This includes the enhanced care, preservation, and digitization of the Museum's vast collection of primary source materials and the creation of a centralized online hub for educational content for students and teachers.

By expanding programming and resources on campus, across the country, and online, the Museum aims to educate five million K-12 students and 15,000 teachers annually by 2035. The Museum will also strengthen the teaching and study of WWII history through increased support and mentorship of higher education faculty, scholars, and students, while its new Sanderson Leadership Center will promote strategic thinking and key leadership principles to new generations of American leaders.

To resource the Museum's goals and initiatives, the Victory's Promise campaign has a fundraising target of \$300 million for three priority areas: capital projects, education and programs, and endowment. Your support, commitment to the Museum's mission, and generosity will have an important impact as the institution expands its outreach to help new audiences connect with history and understand the significance of Allied victory.



Soon, the exhibit will undergo a complete renovation to incorporate new technology, artifacts, and firsthand accounts that will tell the story of the iconic D-Day landings in a more powerful way—and ensure the exhibit remains central to the visitor experience.

VER THE PAST 25 YEARS, a nationwide network of supporters helped build The National WWII Museum into the premier cultural institution it is today. With the launch of the Victory's Promise campaign, the Museum begins a new chapter—one fueled by those who believe in the enduring power of WWII history to shape the future.

Early investors in Victory's Promise are taking up that mantle with commitments that enable the Museum to continue its important work, and by the end of FY25, their combined support had already raised more than \$46 million.

Among the first major investors in the campaign were Trustee Kevin Clifford and longtime advocate Peggy Floyd, whose early contributions laid the groundwork for progress across the campaign's three key funding areas: support for capital projects, investment in education and programs, and growth in the endowment. They've also inspired a growing community of supporters to follow their lead—supporters who understand that Victory's Promise is not just a campaign but a commitment to ensuring the Museum has the resources to tell the story of the war that changed the world well into the future.

Other early investors include Trustee Phil Satre and his wife, Jennifer, who share a meaningful connection to the legacy of World War II: both were raised by parents who served on the Home Front and the front lines. Supporting the refresh of the Museum's signature cinematic experience, Beyond All Boundaries, is their way to ensure that visitors experience the war's story with the same convictions that shaped their own lives. Additionally, Trustee Greg and Bekki Kowalski's campaign support will enhance the visitor experience across the Museum, from The Higgins Hotel & Conference Center to the outdoor sculpture collection in the heart of campus. Their gift to name the Hotel's lobby, along with their contribution to the Rosie the Riveter sculpture bench, helps make the campus a space that invites learning, reflection, and engagement with WWII history.

Those who have embraced the Museum's vision for its next decade through significant early gifts have helped create momentum for the Victory's Promise campaign. Their support reflects a deep trust that the legacy and values of the WWII generation—determination, sacrifice, courage, and unity—will be preserved and passed on.

TRAILBLAZING TRUSTEE:

Kevin Clifford



Upon reviewing the Museum's strategic plans and funding priorities for its next decade of growth, Kevin Clifford issued a bold challenge to his fellow Trustees: match his \$5 million gift to the Museum's endowment within one year. The result was extraordinary—the Clifford Challenge has thus far raised \$10.375 million as part of Victory's Promise, a powerful testament to his leadership and commitment to securing the Museum's future.

A seasoned investor and retired Chairman and CEO of the American Funds Group, Clifford brings a wealth of financial expertise to the Museum's Board and a clear understanding of what it takes to build enduring institutions. His philanthropic vision is rooted in long-term impact, and his dedication to the Museum's viability is evident in his Board service. A member of the Museum's Investment Committee, Clifford and his fellow committee members are critical to growing and stewarding the endowment. His endowment challenge gift reflects his deep belief in the Museum's educational mission and Victory's Promise. "All of us who love and support the Museum understand the unique challenges involved in raising money for the endowment," Clifford said. "My family and I decided to make this investment to provide a catalyst as we challenge my fellow Board members to join us in bringing attention to this most important work."

With the completion of the campus Master Plan, the Museum now focuses its attention on extending its reach to bring the critical and timeless legacies of World War II to the broadest audience possible. Technology, education, and accessibility will play crucial roles in this effort, and the Clifford family's \$8 million investment in the campaign to support the refresh of *Beyond All Boundaries* and build the endowment will provide vital support for Victory's Promise initiatives.

Reflecting on what lies ahead, Clifford said, "This IS the next chapter in the growth of the Museum, and we could not be prouder to play a role in launching this effort."

Building the Endowment

As the third pillar of the Victory's Promise campaign, growing the endowment is essential to securing the Museum's long-term future.

Serving as a permanent financial foundation, a strong and healthy endowment fulfills the campaign's final promise: to keep WWII history alive so that all generations can be inspired by this pivotal time in our nation's history and better understand the price of freedom.

David Nierenberg and his wife, Patricia, were the first to answer fellow Trustee Kevin Clifford's \$5 million endowment challenge, responding with a \$3 million commitment of their own. "Kevin's gift and our pledge match demonstrate that those of us on the Board and the Museum's Investment Committee—who understand both the mission of the Museum and the mission of the endowment—are fully behind the campaign. That should inspire other prospective donors."

And indeed, it did. Soon after, current Trustee Governor Pete Wilson and his wife, Gayle, and former Trustee Bob Hayes each contributed major lead gifts, followed by generous support from Trustees Mike Bylen, Jimmy Reiss, Todd Ricketts, Jimmy Maurin, and Fleur Harlan, bringing the matched total to \$5.375 million. "I was so pleased to learn more about the Clifford Challenge and have an opportunity to show just how much the Museum means to me by participating," said Harlan.

These early gifts to the Museum's endowment highlight how critical it is to ensure the Museum can scale its impact for future generations.

As Nierenberg said, "the single best thing that we can do to preserve freedom is to make sure our descendants are as aware of the preciousness of freedom as the Greatest Generation was—and that is funded largely by the Museum's endowment."

Rising 80 feet above Founders Plaza, the Governor Pete Wilson Liberty Flagstaff is a striking symbol of the patriotism that defined the WWII generation. At its 2017 dedication, Governor Wilson spoke passionately about supporting the Museum's core values: freedom, sacrifice, and national unity—principles he and his wife, Gayle, have long championed.

A US Marine and lifelong public servant, Pete served in the California State Assembly, as mayor of San Diego, as US senator, and as governor of California. During World War II, Pete's father actively supported the war effort, leaving a lasting impression on his young son. When the Museum opened in 2000. Gavle knew its mission would resonate with her husband. They visited soon after and were Members by 2002, with Pete eagerly joining the Board of Trustees.

Pete became Board Chair in 2006, just after Hurricane Katrina devastated the city of New Orleans and threatened the future of the Museum. In this time of uncertainty, he helped guide the Museum toward recovery, securing critical funds and chairing the Road to Victory Capital Campaign Steering Committee. His leadership was pivotal in advancing the Museum's ambitious campus Master Plan.

As Four-Star Patriots Circle Members, Pete and Gayle have supported the Museum through every phase for over 20 years. Their recent major lead gift to the Victory's Promise campaign will help fund the endowment, reflecting their enduring commitment to the Museum's nationwide educational initiatives. Together, their contributions—both visionary and philanthropic—have helped shape the Museum into the institution it is today.

"[The Museum exists] to tell the world, but particularly future generations of young Americans, how the war was fought, why it was fought, and how it is relevant to today," Pete said.

Scott Dodds

Kingsville, Texas

While traveling through the French countryside on the Museum's Easy Company tour, Scott Dodds realized he was just miles from the village where his father, Edwin Clair Dodds, was wounded during World War II. Recognizing this rare opportunity, Scott persuaded their bus driver to take a detour to the small town after their scheduled excursion. Standing in the very place where his father had once recuperated, Scott felt a powerful connection to his wartime experience.

Edwin Dodds joined the US Army in May 1943 and deployed in October 1944 with the 411th Infantry Regiment of the 103rd Infantry Division. In February 1945, while on night patrol in Alsace-Lorraine, his unit encountered a German patrol. Edwin was wounded in the ensuing skirmish, ending his time in combat. But this unlucky encounter produced two of the few keepsakes Scott has from his father: his Purple Heart and a handwritten postcard describing his first recollections after reaching an aid station, now framed and hanging in Scott's office.

Through the Museum travel programs, Scott has deepened his understanding of his father's journey and connected with the broader history of the European theater. Scott has supported the Museum since its beginnings as The National D-Day Museum, intrigued by the overwhelming history of an entire world at war. Now a Three-Star Patriots Circle Member, he deeply values the Museum's commitment to connecting with young learners. "I'm impressed by how the Museum helps children understand that World War II still shapes the world we live in today," he shared. "It's up to us to ensure these stories—and the lessons they carry don't fade with time."

For Beth and Vernon Kliebert, volunteering at the Museum is more than a pastime—it's a personal mission. Together, they find meaning in their conversations with the hundreds of WWII veterans, Home Front workers, and Holocaust survivors they have welcomed to campus. "Volunteering here allows us to share our gratitude," said Beth. "You never know where a conversation here will take you!"

Military service runs in their family. Beth's father, Robert H. Bentel, served as a Supply Petty Officer First Class in the US Navy during World War II and continued his service afterward. Vernon's father, John Kliebert Sr., joined the Navy during the Korean War. Their legacy lives on in Beth and Vernon's oldest son, Christopher, who graduated from the US Naval Academy. As a military family, the Klieberts understand the work ethic and perseverance that defined the WWII generation. Beth cherishes the notes her father kept while stationed at Pearl Harbor—humble reflections from a man who saw himself not as a hero but as an ordinary citizen answering the call to serve. It's this spirit that inspires the Klieberts to give back through their Two-Star Patriots Circle Membership.

Beth and Vernon actively participate in the Museum's educational programs and events. Their hope is that younger generations will also use the Museum's resources to understand the war and carry its lessons forward: they want their grandchildren to grow up in a country that values freedom and champions human justice. As Vernon put it, "It's our mission to educate young people, because the further we get from the war, the more important it becomes to share its legacy through this institution."

After surviving the Battle of the Bulge and imprisonment in a German prisoner-of-war camp, Walter S. Young Jr. had one thing on his mind: food. One morning, he woke to find the camp's guards had vanished, and he and his comrades fled into the nearby woods. At just 98 pounds, the once-athletic Walter could only run so far before eating—so he gathered wild blueberries and used some stolen flour from the camp to make pancakes.

These were the stories Walter shared with his daughter, Ellen McClain—not the horrors of war but the moments of resilience and humor. Like many WWII veterans, he chose to protect his loved ones from his trauma by focusing on more lighthearted memories. Ellen describes him as kind, funny, smart, and committed to living each day to the fullest to honor his comrades who would never have that chance. A Charter Member of the Museum, Walter passed on his love of history and service to Ellen, who first visited when in New Orleans in 2017. She soon became a One-Star Patriots Circle Member and recently upgraded to the Two-Star level for FY26, dedicated to preserving not only her father's story but the stories of all who served.

Fortunately, Walter's father had encouraged him to write down his wartime experiences. Ellen treasures these writings—not just as family heirlooms but as vital pieces of our national memory. She believes that without the human element, the war becomes too vast to grasp. That's why she's excited about the Museum's expanding educational efforts. "It's reassuring for me that the Museum's focus is forward leaning, looking to bring new generations into the fold," she said. "I want them to question, do research, and educate themselves—taking these lessons to heart."



Robert and Mary Severson joined the Stephen E. Ambrose Legacy Society to honor their fathers, both of whom served their country in World War II.

Mary's father, John W. Schild, and his family immigrated to the United States from Switzerland when he was a child. John left high school at 15 to join the US Army National Guard. After basic training, John boarded the USS Monterey in San Francisco for a journey to Australia, where he would join the 32nd Red Arrow Division in Brisbane for combat training before landing in New Guinea. There he and his fellow soldiers faced harsh conditions as they slept on hard ground and in foxholes, fought off insects and snakes, and faced tropical illnesses. John was in Manila, Philippines, ready to board a ship with the 32nd Division when General Douglas MacArthur's voice came over the loudspeaker announcing that he had accepted the official surrender of Japan.

Robert's father, Robert E. Severson Sr., served along with four of his nine siblings. After enlisting in the Army, Robert Sr. took part in the peacekeeping effort and removal of weapons from northern Japan and its northernmost islands. As a member of the 11th Airborne Division, he received several promotions, rising to Sergeant and serving as a drill instructor where, in one of his classes, only 50 out of 200 men made it through parachute jumps. Following his honorable discharge, he completed high school and worked on the family farm before becoming a plumber. Robert Sr. enjoyed 60 years of marriage to his bride, Helen, and raised four children. He never talked about the war until a trip to Alaska with Robert Jr. and his wife, Mary. While dining atop a mountain, he was reminded of his time in Japan and started reminiscing about his duties in the war that changed the world.



Robert Stevenson Boyd Orlando, Florida

WWII veteran Robert "Bob" Boyd was an avid supporter and frequent visitor of The National WWII Museum. After graduating high school in 1941, Bob attended William & Mary College and worked for Sears, Roebuck & Co. and the Norfolk/Portsmouth ferry system before he was drafted for military service in 1942. After graduating from the US Army Air Corps Aviation Cadet Pilot Program, he flew B-24 bombers until his older brother, Todd, was killed in Germany. With his other brother, Irvin, serving in the Pacific and his father having passed away several years prior, Bob was transferred stateside and began training younger pilots. After the war ended, he managed a mobilization assignment at Langley Field, Virginia, as an Air Force Reserve volunteer and then worked in banking.

A lifelong aviation enthusiast, Bob enjoyed telling stories about his time flying B-24s and discussing the aircraft's shortcomings. In 2014, while attending Todd's flight group reunion in the Museum's US Freedom Pavilion: The Boeing Center, Bob and a fellow pilot debated for an hour about which plane was more poorly constructed, the B-17 or the B-24.

Bob passed away in 2021 at the age of 96. As a member of the Stephen E. Ambrose Legacy Society, Bob's estate provided for naming a room at The Higgins Hotel & Conference Center in his honor, installing a Victory Paver bearing his name on the Museum's campus, and making a legacy gift to the Museum's endowment.
